REGULATIONS OF FLEECE COMPETITION

1. The Regulations appearing in this Schedule form part of the General Regulations and conditions of entry to an Event at the Royal Melbourne Show. In the event of any inconsistency between the General Regulations and these Regulations, the General Regulations shall prevail to the extent of the inconsistency unless the General Regulations provide otherwise.

ENTRY FORMS

2. All entry forms must be forwarded to the Event Coordinator, the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria Limited, Melbourne Showgrounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, Vic 3032 before 4:00 pm Friday 13 August 2010.

ENTRY FEES

3. An Entry Fee of \$15.00 per exhibit is required if the fleece is not donated to the Leukaemia Foundation.

4. No Entry Fee applies to an exhibit donated to the Leukaemia Foundation.

5. No Entry Fee applies to an exhibit entered in the District Fleece Competition.

6. All donated fleeces and Exhibits entered in the District Fleece Competition will be sold, with the proceeds from their sale donated to the Leukaemia Foundation.

FLEECE DELIVERY

7. All Exhibits must be delivered to the RASV or Australian Wool Handlers, Frederick Street, Brooklyn, Vic, 3012 by Friday 13 August 2010.

8. All exhibitors must place an Exhibit Card inside each fleece bag.

9. Exhibits must be delivered in sturdy (preferably clear) plastic bags, or wool packs, with Exhibit Cards placed inside.

10. Fleece bags will be available from the RASV upon request.

11. Black and Coloured fleece Exhibitors are required to state if the fleece entered is either a Ram or a Ewe/Wether on the Entry Form and Exhibit Card.

FLEECE COLLECTION

12. All fleeces not donated to the Leukaemia Foundation must be collected from the Showgrounds on the following dates and times:

a) Tuesday 28 September 2010 between 4:00pm and 6:00pm.

b) Wednesday 29 September – Friday 1 October 2010 between 10:00am - 4:00pm.

All fleeces not collected will be sold, with the proceeds of the sale donated to the Leukaemia Foundation.

FLEECE DISPLAY

13. The RASV will make every effort to display all Exhibits entered in the Fleece Competition for the duration of the 2010 Royal Melbourne Show.

EXHIBITS

14. There are no restrictions to the number of Exhibits entered by an Exhibitor.

15. Fleeces are to be shorn from sheep that have been the true property of the Exhibitor for at least six months prior to being shorn.

MICRON CATEGORIES

16. The following micron (μ) categories will apply to all Merino classes:

TESTING

17. All Skirted and District fleeces will be micron, staple length, strength and yield tested by the Australian Wool Testing Authority Ltd (AWTA).

18. Test results will be used during the judging process.

LOSS OR DAMAGE

19. The RASV shall not be responsible for loss or damage to any Exhibit irrespective of the cause of such loss or damage.

FIRST TIME EXHIBITORS

20. Exhibitors will be considered first time Exhibitors if they have never competed at the Royal Melbourne Show, or if they have not competed in any of the previous 10 Royal Melbourne Shows.

DISTRICT FLEECE COMPETITION

21. An Exhibit in the District Fleece Competition must have previously won a Championship at a District Agricultural Show.

JUDGING

22. Judging will take place on Friday 27 August 2010.

23. Judges may transfer fleeces into a more appropriate class if it is considered to have been entered in an incorrect class. Unskirted or insufficiently skirted fleeces will be correctly skirted under the direction of the Chief Steward or Supervisor in charge.

24. Fleeces that in the opinion of the Judges are overgrown, will be judged accordingly and potentially penalised by up to 20 points.

25. The RASV reserves the right to draw a 200gram sample from each Exhibit for its own use.

26. No Championship will be awarded, if the opinion of the Chief Judge, no Exhibit warrants a Championship Award.

27. Ribbons will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place getters.

WEANER FLEECES

28. Weaner fleeces must be untipped and shorn from hoggets or weaners.

JUDGING CRITERIA

29. Fleeces to be judged on the following point systems in the relevant competition:

Soundness	6 points
Handle	16 points
Colour or bloom	16 points
Character	10 points
Density	6 points
Evenness	10 points
Yield %	20 points

Maximum 100 points

Samples in the lambs' wool competition to contain not less than 450g of wool and must be untipped and shorn from lambs, not hoggets or weaners.

SKIRTED (classes 10-41) AND DISTRICT (classes 48-61) FLEECE

Sheep fleece judging will be based on the National Council of Wool Selling Brokers (NCWSB) scale of points. Judges will take account of the objective measurements and will apply a "productivity bonus" if the clean fleece weight (CFW) is heavier than that required for maximum points on the NCWSB scale.
